Aseptic Containers	X		
Large Item Pick-Up	X		Residents of single-family homes can schedule two free cleanups per calendar year. Businesses and residents of multifamily residential complexes can also schedule but fees apply. The fee varies depending on the number and type of items collected. Contact Info: (650)589-4020
Cans	X		Empty cans belong in a blue recycling bin labeled “Containers Only” or under the blue lid of a split recycling cart. When possible, please rinse and drain cans before recycling.
Cardboard	X		Cardboard must be clean, dry, and flat for recycling. Brown paper tubes (like for toilet paper and paper towels) and pressboard boxes (like for cereal) are accepted along with standard corrugated shipping boxes. Wax-coated boxes, pizza boxes, and any box with food or beverage residue can be composted but not recycled. Please put those in your organics cart or bin. Flatten and cut cardboard into pieces no larger than about 2' x 2'. Place under the gray lid of your split recycling cart or bundle (using any kind of string) and place it next to the blue recycling cart on collection day.
Food Scraps	X		All food scraps– fresh, frozen, cooked, raw, or moldy– belong in the organics. Even the bones, shells, and pits!

Household Batteries	X		Put clear tape over both ends of each button battery and over the terminals of any lithium or 9V battery. Contain all used household batteries (lead, cadmium, nickel, lithium such as AA, AAA, C, D, 9V, button/watch/hearing aide, camera) inside a clear bag and zip or tie shut. Put the bag on top of the closed garbage cart lid on your collection day. Bag should be no larger than 1 gallon and be relatively full so it's easy for a garbage truck driver to spot. Newspaper	X	<p>Clean, dry newspaper belongs under the gray lid of a split recycling cart or in a larger cart or bin labeled “Paper Only.”</p> <p>Newspapers can also be placed in an organics bin. In fact, it makes a good kitchen pail liner– it absorbs moisture and odor.</p>
Oil	X	<p>The San Mateo County Household Hazardous Waste Program offers multiple options for the safe disposal of auto fluids. Curbside collection of used motor oil & filters is available to residents of single-family homes. Contain used motor oil in original or other sturdy and clearly labeled jug with screw-top lid. Jugs must be 1-gallon or smaller. Contain used oil filters in a clear zip-top bag. Place oil jugs and filter bags next to your blue recycling cart on collection day. Limit of 5 gallons/filters per collection day. All San Mateo County residents can recycle used motor oil & filters, and antifreeze at Blue Line Transfer, Inc. There is a limit of 10 gallons/filters per day. Original or other sturdy and clearly labeled containers must be used. Fluids cannot be mixed. Lids must be secure. There is no charge for disposal if no other waste items are disposed during the same trip.</p>
Oil Filters	X	<p>Residents of San Mateo County can take used motor oil and filters to a free drop-off location. For a map of locations and more information, please visit the San Mateo County Health website. Residents of single-family homes in South San Francisco, Millbrae and Brisbane can also have used motor oil and filters collected curbside. Simply place used motor oil and filters next to your recycling cart on your regular collection day. Oil must be contained in original container or other labeled jug with screw-top lid. Plastic laundry detergent (Tide for example) and bleach jugs work well. Jugs must be 1-gallon or smaller. Used oil filters must be sealed inside a clear zip-top bag.
